DRIVING DIRECTIONS

From Boston:

West on the Mass. Pike/I-90 to Exit 15. Keep right beyond the toll booth and follow the signs for I-95/128 North. Follow 95/128 North for approximately 2 miles to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right and go over 128 and follow Winter Street for approximately one mile. You'll pass the reservoir on your right, and the road will curve sharply to the right. Immediately after the curve, you'll see the Waltham Woods sign on the left. See below for further directions.

From Points West:

East on the Mass. Pike/I-90 to Exit 14. Keep left beyond the toll booth and follow the signs for I-95/128 North. Follow 95/128 North for approximately 2 miles to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right and go over 128 and follow Winter Street for approximately one mile. You'll pass the reservoir on your right, and the road will curve sharply to the right. Immediately after the curve, you'll see the Waltham Woods sign on the left. See below for further directions.

From Points North:

South on Route 128/I-95 to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right and follow Winter Street for approximately one mile. You'll pass the reservoir on your right, and the road will curve sharply to the right. Immediately after the curve, you'll see the Waltham Woods sign on the left. See below for further directions.

From Points South:

North on Route 128/I-95 to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right and go over 128 and follow Winter Street for approximately one mile. You'll pass the reservoir on your right, and the road will curve sharply to the right. Immediately after the curve, you'll see the Waltham Woods sign on the left. See below for further directions.
